After a wonderful fried chicken dinner, John Kramer from Mecum gave a very informative talk. He discussed the steps in selling a car through the auction.

- First, you have to pay an entry fee and get your spot in the auction. He recommends doing this 4 months before the auction. You can choose to place a reserve amount on your vehicle if you want.
- Then you need to check in early for the auction. There is a 10% cost charged to both the buyer and seller by Mecum to put your car in the auction.

He said the collector car market has never been better, prices are up. Baby Boomers now have money to spend and are choosing to spend it on things they like and are passionate about. He said carefully chosen and well cared for cars prove to be a good investment. He also said the trend is an explosion of vintage pickups and 4-wheel drive vehicles due to the popularity of the new vehicles in those areas. Estate sales for families that have collected cars can change their lives. At one estate sale they had 49 cars and 1 engine. The family got \$20 to \$22 million from the sale. The person had bought his first car in 1965 and continued to the present time.

Mecum also sells tractors, motorcycles, and car memorabilia. They have really expanded their online bidding and phone bidding due to Covid and the way people are buying things now. John said Mecum can transport cars, inspect the vehicles for the buyer, and arrange financing. He said Mecum wants everyone to have a good experience selling their car through their auction and their employees go above and beyond to make this happen.





McPherson College \$500 Million Endowment

Jack Boyle brought the McPherson College Endowment to our attention at our last member meeting. We can all be a part of bringing millions of dollars to this small Kansas Liberal Arts college.

From the McPherson website here is the scoop:

McPherson College has received an irrevocable \$500 million estate commitment to its endowment. It is the largest single commitment to a small, liberal arts college in the United States. As part of the "double-match" estate gift, the anonymous donor will contribute two dollars for every dollar given by others, up to \$500 million in total to the college's endowment.

The college has until June 30, 2023 to meet this target, and is well on its way having raised \$130 million to date.

The match donor has asked to remain anonymous. The donor values their privacy and was adamant the attention be placed on the students and the good work of McPherson College, not themselves. The McPherson College community will honor this request and not comment on the identity of the donor.

As we know, McPherson College has an amazing Automotive Tech Program. While the monies will go to assist students and the various college endeavors, certainly this will bring more students into the college. Just remember any amount you give, will be matched.





Toni Hall's Chicken Pot Pie

Ingredients:

2 pie crusts 1 can cream of chicken soup 1/2 can cream of mushroom soup 1/4 cup sugar 1 can (29 oz) Veg-All drained 2 cups cooked chicken cut in bite size pieces (I like to use Costco's rotisserie chicken) 1/2 stick butter

Step 1 Mix together except butter and pour in pie crust.

Step 2 Cut butter into pats and put on top of the mixture. Top with second pie crust.

Step 3 Bake 375 degrees for 1 hour

Bonnie Johnson's Taco Soup

This is a family favorite made by my daughter-in-law, Stephanie.

Ingredients:

- 2 lb. hamburger
- 3 cans stewed tomatoes, blended
- 1 can corn
- 1 can RANCH brand beans with jalapenos, remove jalapenos if you do not want it hot.

1 pack dry ranch dressing

1 pack taco seasoning

Step 1 Cook and drain hamburger

Step 2 Add stewed tomatoes, corn, Ranch beans, dry ranch dressing and taco seasoning Simmer

Tip: Serve with sour cream and corn chips or Fritos

Meredith Williamson's Ensalada Nochebuena (Christmas Eve Salad) Total time: 30 mins Serves 8

Ingredients:

For The Salad

¹/₂ head romaine lettuce, chopped
2 medium beets, boiled, peeled and sliced* or canned (not pickled)
1 very ripe plantain (yellow with black spots), sliced (optional) or a banana
1 c jicama, peeled and diced (optional) or water chestnuts
1 large sweet apple, sliced into wedges
1 large orange, peeled and sectioned
¹/₂ c peanuts, unsalted

1 c pomegranate arils (seeds)

For The Dressing

¹/₄ c orange juice
2 Tbsp red wine vinegar
1 Tbsp olive oil
1 Tbsp fresh mint or 1 tsp dry mint
¹/₈ tsp salt
Honey or sugar (to taste)

Step 1

Place all prepared vegetables and fruit into a large bowl.

Step 2 Prepare the dressing

Step 3 Add dressing to the salad and serve.
