1. **President** – In addition to presiding at all meetings of the Region and of the Executive Board the President shall:
 - a. Assure that the Region follows the policies, procedures and submissions required by national AACA.
 - b. Track old business and new business items and develop a Membership meeting agenda well in advance of the membership meetings.
 - c. Track old business and new business and develop a Board meeting agenda well in advance of the Board meetings.
 - d. Lead the effort to resolve all problems and conflicts within the Region.
 - e. Relying on assistance and feedback from the other officers, identify, arrange and coordinate programs at the membership meetings.
 - f. Assist other officers as needed in the performance of their duties.
 - g. Authorized to sign checks for approved expenditures.
 - h. Estimated hours spent per month between February & November 6-8

1. **Vice President** – In addition to presiding at any meeting in the absence of the Region President and assuming all said duties the Vice President shall:
 - a. Act as lead planner for all Region activities which requires:

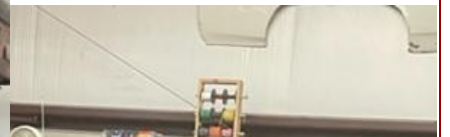
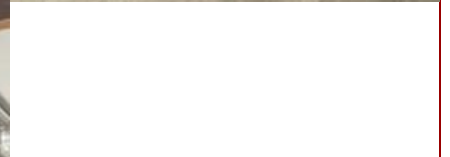

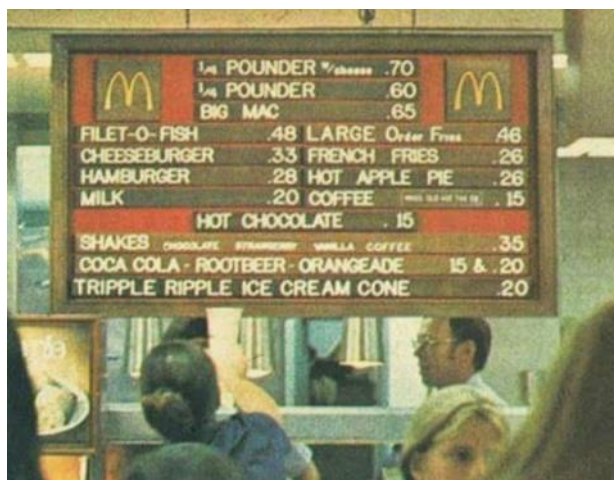

Martie Kernodle's Jalapeno Cornbread

Note: this is not spicy, just yummy

Ingredients:

1 box of Jiffy Corn Muffin Mix
2 Tbl of melted butter
1/3 cup milk
1/2 cup shredded cheddar cheese
1 can (15oz) corn drained or 1 cup frozen corn
1 medium Jalapeno diced (or 2 Tbl. canned Jalapeno)
1 egg

Step 1

Preheat oven to 375 degrees.

Step 2

Using a large mixing bowl add the corn muffin mix and all of the other ingredients and mix until dough is moist. Let it rest for 5 minutes

Step 3

Grease an 8x8 pan and pour the mixture into the pan

Step 4

Bake at 375 degrees about 25 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the middle comes out clean.

Bread will still be very moist when done, so don't let that confuse you with it not being cooked.

Ingredients:

3 Tlb Powered sugar, sifted
1/2 cup Reese's peanut butter (or whatever peanut butter is in the house)
1 cup of milk chocolate chips

Step 1

Prepare a cupcake tin with 6 liners

Step 2

Stir peanut butter and powered sugar together until smooth

Step 3

Spread 1-2 tablespoons of chocolate in the bottom of each cupcake liner

Step 4

Dollop 1-2 teaspoons of the peanut butter mixture on top of the chocolate

Step 5

Cover each dollop of peanut butter with more chocolate and smooth out the top

Step 6

Refrigerate for 1 hour or until the chocolate has hardened
